





What can you do now to prepare for a career in health care?

- ✓ **Load up on science classes.** Anatomy and physiology, biology, and chemistry are all good choices for the highschool-level learner.
- ✓ Consider AP courses as a way to test out of as many introductory courses as possible. Check with the colleges you are considering before you take those courses.
- ✓ Accumulate credit before you get to college. Can you take dual enrollment courses at your local college while you are in high school?
- ✓ Round out your education. Communication classes, technology classes, and higher math can all go a long way in making you better prepared for the health care field.
- ✓ Do volunteer work and/or work in the field. Many positions in the health care field are open to teenagers.
- ✓ Start building your resume and portfolio. Learn how to create a resume. Keep records of your volunteer work.

Paying for College

- 1. Fill out the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)
- 2. Apply for Scholarships
- 3. Get a part-time or full-time job
- 4. Look into tax credits for qualifying college expenses
- 5. Minimize your college costs
- 6. Research tuition assistance programs
- 7. Consider taking out federal student loans



Scholarships, Grants, & Loan Repayment

- **Scholarships** help pay for your tuition while you are in school. Once you decide which health careers and colleges you are interested in you'll need to research available scholarships. Scholarships do not have to be repaid.
- **Grants** can help you pay for school. Most are based on financial need and typically do not have to be repaid but if the obligations haven't been met, some or all of the grant must be paid back. Filling out the FAFSA is the best way to find out which grants you may qualify for.
- Student Loans are an option for many, but keep in mind that they must be repaid. The US Department of Education's federal student loan program is the William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan Program.
- Loan repayment is a way to pay for your education after you have graduated and are working in your chosen field. The National Health Service Corps and the military offer loan repayment options for health professionals in exchange for a service commitment.

College Assistant Migrant Program - CAMP

The College Assistance Migrant Program (CAMP) assists students who are migratory or seasonal farmworkers (or children of such workers) enrolled in their first year of undergraduate studies at an institute of higher education. National Health Service Corps Scholarships

You commit to a minimum of 2 years service in an underserved area in exchange for a full year of scholarship support. You must serve at an NHSC approved site.

Eligible Disciplines include: physician, dentist, nurse practitioner, nurse midwife, and physician assistant

National Health Service Corps Loan Repayment



- NHSC Loan Repayment \$50,000 fulltime; \$25,000 part-time in exchange for a 2 year work commitment at NHSC approved site.
- NHSC Substance Use Disorder Workforce & Rural Community Loan Repayment - \$75,000 fulltime & \$37,500 part-time for SUD; \$100,000 fulltime & \$50,000 part-time. 3 year work commitment.
- Disciplines eligible for all programs: MD/DO, NP, PA, CNM, Health Service Psychologists, Licensed Clinical Social Workers, Psychiatric Nurse Specialists, Marriage & Family Therapists, Licensed Professional Counselors. 3 year work commitment.

HRSA Nurse Corps Scholarship

- Eligible nursing students can apply to the Nurse Corps Scholarship Program (Nurse Corps SP).
- If accepted, HRSA pays your tuition, fees, and other educational costs.
- In return, you work at an eligible facility with a critical shortage of nurses—a Critical Shortage Facility (CSF)—upon graduation.

HRSA Nurse Corps Loan Repayment

- Supports registered nurses (RNs), advanced practice registered nurses (APRNs), and nurse faculty (NF) by paying up to 85% of their unpaid nursing education debt.
- In exchange, accepted applicants work at least two years in one of the thousands of Critical Shortage Facilities (CSFs) across the country, or serve as nurse faculty (NF) in an eligible school of nursing. This includes hospitals, clinics, and other facilities experiencing a critical shortage of nurses.

Idaho State Loan Repayment Program

- \$10,000 \$25,000 per year.
- A two-year service obligation in an approved site is required.
- Eligible disciplines include: MD/DO, NP, PA, RN, CNM, PharmD,
 LCSW, Psychiatric Nurse Specialist, Marriage & Family Therapists,
 Licensed Professional Counselor, Dentist, Rural Dental Hygienist

Rural Physician Incentive Program

- RPIP provides loan repayment for qualifying physicians serving Health Professional Shortage Areas in Idaho. The program is focused on physicians providing primary care medicine, family medicine, internal medicine, and pediatrics.
- Physicians may receive a maximum of \$100,000 over a four year period toward their academic debt. Preference is given to eligible physicians who paid into the RPIP fund, however, funding is not limited to these candidates. RPIP award decisions are made by the Health Care Access and Physician Incentive Grant Review Board.
